Opening a Group Checking Account

1. Secure a permanent mailing address for the Group. This should not be the current Treasurer's home or the address of the facility where the Group holds their meeting. I strongly urge the Group to have a US Post Office Box. The cost is minimal, and up to four (4) Groups in the local area may share a US Post Office Box.

2. Apply for an Employer's Identification Number (EIN) from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) on the computer internet (online) at www.irs.gov. If you don't have a computer, you may use one free of charge at any local library. Find one that has printing capabilities. You will want to print out the completed form and resulting issued EIN number the IRS assigns your group. PLEASE NOTE: the IRS long ago recognized that certain organizations like AA Groups did not want to incorporate, but would need an EIN number for banking purposes.

A. Click on "Online Services for Small Business Taxpayers";
B. Scroll down to "Obtain an Employee Identification Number (EIN) online";

C. Click on "Apply online now";

D. Click on "Begin Application";

E. Click on "View Additional Types";

F. Check "Community or Volunteer Group" and hit Continue;

G. Responsible Party (this information is only used this one time to prevent fraudulent intent and for mailing purposes – please remember the notices will come to the USPO address) – Information Requested is First Middle Last Name, and the Responsible Party's Social Security Number (**second time**, please remember this is only used in this one instance for application purposes and does not mean you are responsible in any way to the IRS for the Group; there are no tax filing requirements);

H. Choose the "I am a responsible and duly authorized officer or member of this organization" and hit Continue;

I. Principal Party located at – please give the **USPO Box or permanent address of the Group** and hit Continue;

J. Name of Group (The Best Group) as an example, County, State and Date Group Started (can be an approximate date) and hit Continue;

K. Information on Group – All Questions should be answered "No" and hit Continue;

L. What does this business do? Hit "Other"; hit Continue

M. Hit "Other" and enter Alcoholics Anonymous Group or Recovery Group, whichever you are most comfortable with – hit Continue;

N. Click on "Receive Letter Online" or you may have EIN Number mailed;

O. Be sure to print this page before hitting "SUBMIT";

P. Please wait two or three minutes before EIN Official Number is granted;

The inmates really enjoy seeing new faces, and it might be your story that brings them to an Alcoholics Anonymous meeting on the outside! To get clearance for taking meetings to jail, you can attend the next orientation on April 25th. Contact Buddy to make a reservation.

If you do not have a PV number, but would still like to carry the message, you CAN! There are detox meetings every day of the week. You can contact Rob T., Detox Coordinator, at 813-453-6059, and he can hook you up with another volunteer. If you've never been to detox, GO! It's a great way to remember where you came from.

If you would like to carry the message to our younger generation, there are opportunities to do this as well. Call Richard G., Juvenile Coordinator, at 813-784-1464. Remember, your kids may need this one day, so you may as well start helping NOW!

The treatment centers NEED YOUR HELP! Please contact Marc A at 813-407-2705. The treatment centers do not require any clearance, length of sobriety, or orientation. The people at these meetings are newly sober and NEED SPONSORS!

Jill J. reported that Women's prison is doing well, and will be providing meetings on Wednesdays and Saturdays, after the time change in March.

If you are currently taking meetings, please bring literature! Our literature is purchased by the money from the Pink Can Drive, and is available at Central Office. Make sure to take the Bridging the Gap cards. These can be handed out at any facility. It provides a toll free number to the person who is being released. Lindsey T. receives the message and then helps to get that person hooked up with meetings in their area. Lindsey "bridged" 3 people this past month.

Q. Print at least five (5) copies – you'll need copy for bank and at least one should be kept with the Group's records.

R. Go to a local bank in the area of your Group. Show your EIN notice to the banker. Order checks as follows:

Your Group Name (NEVER INCLUDE AA IN THE NAME OF THE GROUP)

Group No. 00123456-15-02
P. O. Box 1234
Anytown, Any State 99999-1234

S. The best news is this – that your Group will never have to order new checks, or change banks no matter how many treasurers your Group has – and your banking records will come to a permanent address. Your first supply of checks should last ten years. Of course, you will have to add and delete the Treasurer's name from the bank's records, but your Group will never need to have new checks printed.
