A MEANING BEYOND WORDS

In a way, Step Two has not been a problem to me, and in another way it has been very sticky. When I first staggered into AA, my powers of comprehension were shot. I looked at the Steps and just saw words—it was a good meeting if I managed not to drool. It took me a week to learn the difference between the Big Book and the Bible. Neither of them made very much sense and both had an awful lot of about God. After three weeks I got too busy to go to meetings, and darned if I didn't get drunk again. A couple of months later, in a treatment center, I took a more sober look at the Steps. Powerless, yes. Unmanageable, kinda. "Power greater than myself," "restore to sanity"—OK. Actually, I could have been reading about little green men from Mars, and it wouldn't have mattered to me. I was hurting; theological precision was not a priority. Then one day, during an AA meeting, a voice in the back of my head said, "John, you are alive today in spite of all the insane, destructive things you did over twenty-eight years of drinking. It's not your own strength or wisdom or virtue that got you here. Don't worry about Step Two." This was quite a jolt. After treatment, I stayed dry two weeks and slipped for four more. But I was still going to meetings, and I read in the "Twelve and Twelve" that some of us have to be bludgeoned into humility. And I was praying for the strength or the courage or whatever to stop drinking. Praying to whom? To what? Who knows? I didn't. My idea of Step Three was, if I didn't turn my will and my life over to God, I would soon turn it over to the law enforcement of Oklahoma or to the medical profession. Then something told me to start on a Fourth Step. Progress was slow and painful for months. And then a flash of reality showed me that something was working. I wasn't drinking. I didn't want to drink. Sure, I was crazy as hell and miserable, but I was sobering up. The program of Alcoholics Anonymous and the Twelve Steps were working in my life. God was doing for me what I could never do for myself. It was the most powerful experience of my life. The rest of the Steps aren't easy. Living is hard work. The spirituality of the program has affected everything about my life. Marvelous things are now possible that were unthinkable before. My idea of God is as foggy as ever, but my feeling of awe and delight at the mystery and power of creation, reality, truth—it's wonderful.

I guess-a-mate that there were over 250 interested AA'ers who showed up to celebrate in the festivities. I even dressed up and worn a polo shirt instead of my normal T-shirt. I got to fellowship with a lot of old friends I had not seen in a while and generally had a great time. I was honored with a chance to talk with the Speaker for a few minutes before and after the meeting. The Dinner consisted of beef over noodles, salad, rolls, ice tea, coffee and lots of ice cream, catered by Tanya & Matt's Ice Cream. Although I was one of the last to go thru the food line, there was still plenty left for me to enjoy. I was totally enthralled by the speaker William B. who has been sober since 1962 and especially enjoyed his talk when he got around to talking about Lois Wilson—Founder of Al-Anon. William B. is also the author of the movie My Name is Bill W. and The Lois Wilson Story: When Love is Not Enough. William began his career as a journalist, working first as a reporter for one of the New York City's largest daily newspapers. All through his early years as a reporter and writer, drinking was a normal way of life. After writing for a national magazine and creating syndicated shows for radio, William became a partner with an independent film and went on to produce some movies such as Kansas City Bomber, Serpico and Dog Day Afternoon. After moving into their new home in South Carolina and while unpacking some boxes, William discovered some audio tapes he had made some years before when interviewing Lois Wilson. He and his wife Bernadette had through-out his sober life become very close friends with Lois and listening to one of her tapes he realized that little of what Lois had shared with him about her own experiences that resulted from her husband's bout with alcoholism had been used in the film he had written called, My Name Is Bill W. As a close friend of Lois Wilson's, William knew her own personal story was moving and powerful and he believed that people the world over needed to hear it. So he sat down and wrote the book, The Lois Wilson Story: When Love Is Not Enough. He has also written another book called 1000 Years of Sobriety consisting of the stories of 20 AA members with 50 years of sobriety.

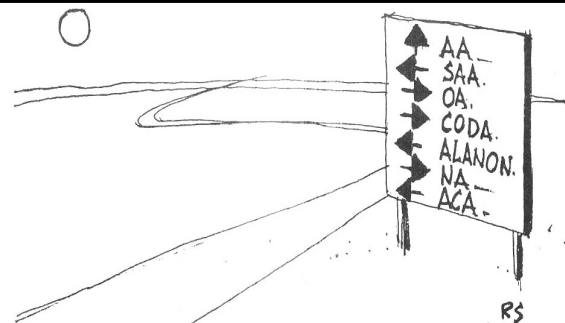

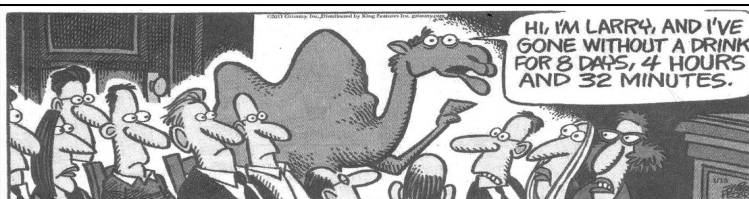
